Easy to grow, perfect for salsa verde.

Early Jalapeno

The best variety for cooler climates.



Candy Cane Sweet

Wonderfully sweet, easy-to-grow and pretty pepper.



Hot Cherry

Mild hotness, perfect for pickling or adding to salsa.



Cayenne

Fiery red, great for hot sauce or dehydrating.



Hungarian Wax

Mild "hot" pepper ripening to deep red with increasing spiciness. Great for pickling.



Red Knight

Big sweet green bell pepper that ripens to red.

Rainbow Chard

Brilliant stems and lush foliage.



Vulcan Lettuce

Productive ruffled red leafed. Cut and come again.



Romaine Lettuce

Green Forest, early tall and dark green.



Collards

Champion variety, prolific from spring through fall.



Tuscan Kale

Rich dark green leaves can be harvested all season long.



Curly Kale

Curly kale, much softer and sweeter than what you find in the grocery store.



Spinach

Thick, sweet leaves with juicy texture.



Mustard Greens

Spicy hot greens can be harvested as baby leaves or full size.

A downy-mildew resistant, prolific variety for slicing.



Boston Pickling

Stout fruits perfect for pickling.



Lemon

Crisp, mild heirloom variety.



Cucamelon

Mexican sour gherkin. Great for kids and fun to eat.

Green Machine

Bush zucchini that continuously cranks out perfect fruit.



Golden Zucchini

Bush variety with thin, beautiful yellow skin.



Eggplant

Glossy black 1lb fruits. Sets well in cooler temps and produces late into the fall.



Butterscotch Butternut

Mildew-resistant, rich flavored butternut.



Honeybear Acorn

Semi-bush, small fruits, very sweet.



Kabocha

Delicious, very sweet, semi-bush. Perfect for pies.



Howland Pumpkin

Big, dark orange variety perfect for carving.





Sweet Basil

Classic aroma and flavor, mildew resistant.



Holy Basil

Also known as Tulsi, it is grown for its aromatic leaves used in teas and cooking.



Purple Basil

Same flavor as sweet basil but beautiful purple leaves.



Green Onion

Mild flavor, grows very quick; cut and come again.



Italian Parsley

Flat-leafed, fresh tasting herb; may overwinter.



Cilantro

Coriander, essential to Latin, Asian and Indian dishes. Seeds can be dried, too.



Chamomile

Traditionally used in natural remedies and teas. Self-sows.



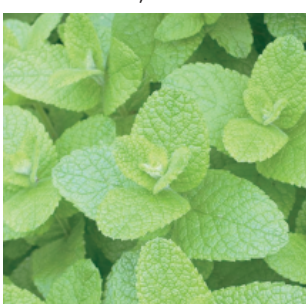
Bouquet Dill

Easy to grow, zesty flavor. Beautiful yellow flowers.



Geranium

Intensely rose scented, wonderful in rose-flavored desserts or potpourri.



Apple Mint

Lovely, sweet, fruity. Perennial.



Lemon Balm

Citrus-scented herb in the mint family.



Lavender

English lavender, will survive the winter and produce for years.



Calendula

Reblooming flower for teas and self-care recipes.



Sage

Easy to grow perennial.



Covina Broccoli

Good variety for northern climates, produces best in cool weather.



Mini Broccoli

Tender and sweet, very mild flavor (leaves are edible too!).



Provider Bean

Prolific, easy to grow uniform bush green beans.



Mokum Carrot

Uniform sweet early-season carrot. Grows best in pots or soft soil.



Sugarsnap Pea

Extra sweet with edible pods. Kids love them.



Radish

Perfect red roots with big juicy and spicy flavor.



Sweet Corn

Rosie F1 beautiful, uniform ears and very sweet.



Fennel

Bright white bulbs with sweet, aromatic, juicy flesh. Fronds can be used as an herb.



Cantaloupe

Honey-sweet and early ripening



Strawberry

June-bearing Earliglow variety, highly productive even in first year of planting.

DYE FLOWERS



Japanese Indigo

Easy to grow. Harvest before plant goes to seed. Dye using salt for blue results, or green without.



Orange Marigold

Extra large blooms, results in earthy orange dye.



Black Knight Scabiosa

Rich purple flowers on sturdy stems, primarily dyes purple.



Golden Coreopsis

Fluffy globe-like flowers, very rich dye resulting in yellows or oranges depending on preparation methods.



Yellow Marigold

Extra large blooms; can dye yellow or earthy green depending on preparation methods.



Sulfur Cosmos

Prolific bloomer, mixed deep red-orange to light yellow flowers resulting in vibrant yellow and orange dyes.

NATIVE PERENNIALS



Purple Coneflower

Echinacea purpurea, prized for its medicinal use and loved by native bees.



Brown-Eyed Susan

Rudbeckia triloba. cheerful daisy-like flowers, will spread over time.



Bee Balm

Monarda citriodora, produces sweet nectar loved by bees and hummingbirds.

Mixed Strawflowers

Annual, can grow over 4 ft tall. Mixed colors, may include purple, orange, pink, rose, white, and/or red. Harvest just before full bloom and hang upside down to dry. Will retain shape and color for many years.



Mixed Gomphrena

Annual, adorable little lollipop blooms, compact habit. Mixed colors, may include purple, carmine, orange, white or red. Harvest and hang upside down to dry until stems are stiff. Will retain shape and color for many years.



Mixed Statice

Annual, elegant sprays of color. Mixed colors, may include deep purple, apricot, white, or yellow. Harvest and hang upside down to dry. Will retain shape and color for many years.



POTS

Our plants are potted in compostable 4-inch peat pots. They can be planted directly into the soil in the pot to reduce transplant shock. We sell individual plants and 4-packs during the month of May or until supplies last.
