One of the most popular and best-tasting heirlooms.



### Striped German

A beautiful large, marbled slicing variety.



### Valencia

Very mild, lower acid yellow slicer.



### Cherokee Purple

A medium-sized, maroon beefsteak heirloom.



### Green Zebra

Stays green when ripe, very mild flavor. Up your rainbow tomato game.



### Pink Boar

Juicy and rich salad variety.



### San Marzano Paste

The standard paste tomato perfect for canning.

## CHERRY TOMATOES



### SunGold

Cute grape-sized tomatoes bursting with tang.



### Supersweet Cherry

One of the first to fruit and the last to stop.



### Black Cherry

Delicious and prolific mid-size cherry

### Lunchbox Sweet

Mixed colors, beautiful mini sweet peppers bursting with flavor.



### Early Jalapeno

The best variety for cooler climates.



### Ancho Poblano

Moderate heat, delicious when roasted and stuffed.



### Hot Cherry

Mild hotness, perfect for pickling or adding to salsa.



### Cayenne

Fiery red, great for hot sauce or dehydrating.



### Hungarian Wax

Mild "hot" pepper ripening to deep red with increasing spiciness. Great for pickling.



### Red Knight

Big sweet green bell pepper that ripens to red.

## GREENS

### Rainbow Chard

Brilliant stems and lush foliage.



### Red Leaf Lettuce

Productive ruffled red leafed. Cut and come again.



### Romaine Lettuce

Green Forest, early tall and dark green.



### Collards

Champion variety, prolific from spring through fall.



### Tuscan Kale

Rich dark green leaves can be harvested all season long.



### Curly Kale

Much softer and sweeter than what you find in the grocery store.



### Red Curly Kale

Beautiful red-purple leaves.



### Mustard Greens

Spicy hot greens can be harvested as baby leaves or full size.



## GREENS

**Arugula**

Harvest young for a spicy kick in salads.



**Escarole**

Crisp, clean flavor. The only lettuce you can cook!



**Spinach**

Thick, sweet leaves with juicy texture.



## VEGGIES

**Broccoli**

Good variety for northern climates, produces best in cool weather.



**Spring Raab**

Slightly spicy, tender shoots. Great sauteed or raw.



**Provider Bean**

Prolific, easy to grow uniform bush green beans.



**Mokum Carrot**

Uniform sweet early-season carrot. Grows best in pots or soft soil.



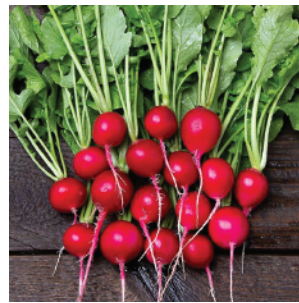
**Sugarsnap Pea**

Extra sweet with edible pods. Kids love them.



**Snow Pea**

Sweet, tender flat pods.



**Radish**

Perfect red roots with big juicy and spicy flavor.



**Sweet Corn**

Rosie F1 beautiful, uniform ears and very sweet.



**Red Cabbage**

Bright and crisp, keeps well overwinter.



**Bok Choy**

Harvest young for salads, or later for a delightful crunch.



**Leeks**

Easier to grow than onions!



**Brussels Sprouts**

Top them for large, uniform sprouts. Delicious roasted!



# CUCUMBERS

**DMR Slicer**

A downy-mildew resistant, prolific variety for slicing.



**Boston Pickling**

Stout fruits perfect for pickling.



**Lemon**

Crisp, mild heirloom variety.



**Armenian**

A member of the melon family, large, tender and sweet.

# SQUASH

**Green Machine**

Bush zucchini that continuously cranks out perfect fruit.



**Golden Zucchini**

Bush variety with thin, beautiful yellow skin.



**Patty Pan**

Harvest young for tenderness. Perfect for calabacitas.



**Eggplant**

Glossy black 1 lb fruits. Sets well in cooler temps and produces late into the fall.



**Honeynut**

Smaller, sweeter butternut variety.



**Honeybear Acorn**

Semi-bush, small fruits, very sweet.



**Delicata**

Tender skin, medium sweetness, bush variety.



**Howland Pumpkin**

Big, dark orange variety perfect for carving.



**Sunlight**

Yellow, medium sized pumpkin



**Shiver**

White, smooth skinned pumpkin



**Black Bear**

Rare (almost) black variety



## HERBS

### Sweet Basil

Classic aroma and flavor, mildew resistant.



### Holy Basil

Also known as Tulsi, it is grown for its aromatic leaves used in teas and cooking.



### Purple Basil

Same flavor as sweet basil but beautiful purple leaves.



### Thai Basil

Traditionally used in Asian cooking, stronger anise flavor than Italian basil.



### Italian Parsley

Flat-leafed, fresh tasting herb; may overwinter.



### Cilantro

Coriander, essential to Latin, Asian and Indian dishes. Seeds can be dried, too.



### Chamomile

Traditionally used in natural remedies and teas. Self-sows.



### Dill

Easy to grow, zesty flavor. Beautiful yellow flowers.



### Green Onion

Mild flavor, grows very quick; cut and come again.



### Lemon Balm

Citrus-scented herb in the mint family.

## FRUIT

### Cantaloupe

Honey-sweet and early ripening



### Strawberry

June-bearing Earliglow variety, highly productive even in first year of planting.



### Cucamelon

Mexican sour gherkin. Great for kids and fun to eat.





## POTS

---

Our plants are potted in compostable 4-inch peat pots. They can be planted directly into the soil in the pot to reduce transplant shock. We sell individual plants during the month of May or until supplies last.
